Easter Scavenger Hunt

Gather the following items: leaf, crackers, cross, piece of cloth, rock, empty egg, piece of candy

Hide each item for a scavenger hunt. Give your child the first clue and then include a clue to the next location with each item. As they find and bring you the item, tell the story from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to His resurrection.

Leaf - represents Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, the people waved palm branches and shouted Hosanna! (Matthew 21:1-11)

Crackers - represents the Last Supper. Jesus had a meal with the disciples and told them what was about to happen. He gave them bread to represent His body and wine to represent His blood. When we take communion, we are remembering what Jesus did for us. (Matthew 26:17-30)

Cross - represents the cross. Jesus died so that we can be forgiven of our sins. (Matthew 27:32-56)

Piece of Cloth - represents Jesus' burial clothes. They wrapped Jesus in cloths and placed His body in a tomb. (Matthew 27:58-60)

Rock - represents the stone covering the tomb. A large stone was rolled in front of the tomb and soldiers guarded it so that no one could steal Jesus' body. (Matthew 27:59-60)

Empty Egg - represents the empty tomb. When Jesus' friends and disciples came to the tomb, it was empty! (Matthew 28:1-6)

Piece of Candy - Jesus is alive! How sweet it is to know that Jesus is alive! He is risen! (Matthew 28:1-10)
